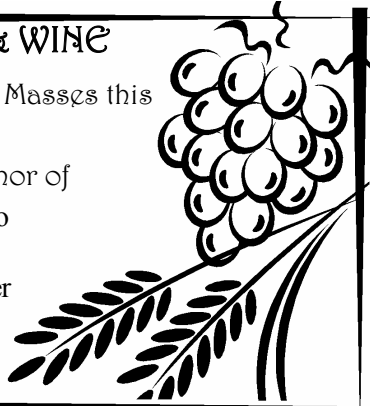

FROM THE DESK OF FR. MIKE

“At the sight of the crowd, Jesus’ heart was moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd.” There can be nothing worse for a flock of sheep than to be without a shepherd! Without a shepherd to watch over them, the sheep will destroy themselves. They can easily drown, walk off cliffs, or fall prey to the wolves, or tigers, and lions, and bears—Oh my! Jesus sees this crowd of people who are coming to Him, as the *Lost Sheep of Israel*. The people who had fallen away because the Pharisees had made the practice of the faith so impossible that people believed they could not live it, so why bother? For the Lost Sheep, God was **too far away**, and they believed that God would not listen to them anyway. So Jesus is showing **them a new way**—a way not caught up in the **613 Precepts of the Law** but, caught up in the **Love of God and ones neighbor**.

Jesus wants to draw the Lost Sheep back to Himself; He wants back the very people God called to Himself in the *Desert of Sinai*. As we read in today’s 1st Reading as God makes the Covenant with Israel, *“Therefore, if you hearken to my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my special possession, dearer to me than all other people... You shall be to me a kingdom of priests, a holy nation.”*

Jesus would not let them stay lost, and He wanted them back so much that He had pity on them and even though He was tired, still answered their call and shepherded them. Jesus is so dedicated to them that He calls others to help Him shepherd the people—the 12 Apostles. Please understand that this *pity* that Jesus feels for the Lost Sheep goes much deeper than the English word *pity* conveys. What

Jesus felt for this people, was more like the meaning behind the Greek word **SPLANCHNIZO**—which is more of a feeling from one’s gut, a profound sense of empathy, being moved from the very depth of His being.

Christ does not want the House of Israel to be without the guidance and care of the Shepherd—for He loves them so much. So, He tells the 12—who we see named in today’s Gospel— that the harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few, and that they, like Him, are to go out and announce the good news and do it without payment. Jesus gives them a share of His power to cast out demons, and cure disease and illness. All the Lost Sheep are to be called back—the rich and the poor, the noble and the common, the free and the slave, even the sinner and the tax collector.

That’s great for the Lost Sheep of Israel—who are the only ones Jesus is commanding the Apostles to seek out in today’s Gospel, but what about us? Well there is good news for us, because we are also meant to be part of this call—but not at the time Jesus first sent out the disciples. Remember, this 1st call is for the Lost Sheep because they

are the Chosen People who the Messiah was promised to, Jesus only had the 3 years for His Public Ministry. So, He had only so much time to act. First, salvation has to come to the Chosen People. Then, through them and from them, to the rest of the world. We see this at the end of Matthew’s Gospel when Jesus tells the Apostles, before He ascends into Heaven, “Go out and teach all nations, baptizing them in The Name of The Father, and of The Son, and of The Holy Spirit.” And of course, this call is not just for one people or for one generation, but for the whole Human Family until Christ comes again.

But now the charge given to the Apostles is now given to us, the Church who is made one with God not through the Covenant at Sinai, but through the greater Covenant made with us through the Body and Blood of Christ (through His life, death, and resurrection). So, we are on a Mission, to go out and work in the fields and bring back not only the Lost Sheep of Israel, but also, the Lost Sheep from the Church and the Lost Sheep who do not even know Jesus. As members of the Body of Christ, we cannot stand idly by and let the sheep be lost. Remember, the Sheep cannot exist peacefully and without danger if they do not have a Shepherd. It is the duty of both the clergy and the laity, out of love for God and the Lost Sheep, to lead the Sheep back to the Good Shepherd. And He who was moved with pity for them will do the rest.

This weekend at all of the Masses *Maryann and John Maddock* will be speaking about the *Diocesan Mission located in The Dominican Republic*. This is part of the Annual Summer Mission Appeal, and this year the proceeds will go to support the Mission run by our own Diocesan Priests, Religious Sisters, and Laity. The people of St. Joseph’s have always been generous when it comes to helping those in need—please help again. There will be a 2nd Collection taken up for the support of the Mission. If you would like to support the Mission, but can not do so today, you can drop off your donation at the Rectory during the week.

Remember, the **St. Joseph’s School Golf Outing on June 27th** and the **Summer Family Festival in July**. Both are a lot of fun, with great food, and a big help to support the School and the Parish. We do need volunteers for the Festival to help us on the many nights and for the food or games. And we need all of the members of the parish to come out and enjoy this wonderful week in July. See you there!

RESPECT LIFE



Umbilical cord proposals gain momentumon May 9, 2005, the NYS Assembly unanimously passed A.3346, legislation sponsored by Assemblywoman Patricia Eddington (D-Patchogue). This particular bill would authorize the State Health Department to review the research using umbilical cord

blood, and make recommendations to promote its use.

Meanwhile, numerous other measures have been introduced to promote cord blood research and treatment, an ethical alternative to embryonic stem cell research. They include:

A.457 by Assemblyman Joseph Lentol (D-Brooklyn) would require health professionals to advise pregnant women of their option to donate cord blood, mandate a public awareness campaign and provide for the collection, preservation and storage of the blood.

A.7926 by Assemblyman Ivan Lafayette (D-Queens) would require health professionals to advise pregnant women of their option to donate cord blood.

S.5132 by Senator Kenneth Lavelle (R-Selden) would establish a task force on the medical use of umbilical cord blood in the treatment of human disease.

The New York State Catholic Conference supports all of these measures and urges the state to move forward in promoting and funding this successful and ethical area of stem cell research and therapy.

“Blood from umbilical cords—a byproduct of normal childbirth—is a good source of hematopoietic progenitor cells (HPCs), the type of stem cells also found in bone marrow that give rise to various kinds of blood cells. Transplants of these stem cells have saved the lives of roughly 20,000 Americans with leukemia, lymphoma, sickle cell anemia, and several their illnesses in recent years.”---from a new report on cord blood by the Institute of Medicine of the National Academies, released April 14, 2005. The report recommends a centralized national cord blood banking program.

Catholic Ministries Appeal 2005

Catholic Charities is the largest beneficiary of the Catholic Ministries Appeal now underway in our parishes. Last year Catholic Charities served over 80,000 people, including the homeless, those with HIV/AIDS, seniors with disabilities, single mothers, those struggling with mental illness, families without health insurance and the marginalized.

To fully appreciate the vital work in which Catholic Charities engages, we need to examine how individual lives have been changed. Joan (not her real name) is a 56-year-old woman suffering from a mild mental retardation. While still a young girl, she lost both of her parents and was forced to enter a Suffolk County facility for people with disabilities. While at the center, Joan showed she could be very productive in a number of different jobs and it was clear that she had the potential to live more independently.

She moved to the Catholic Charities' Christopher Residence located in Valley Stream, a more home-like environment. She continued to work and she was

known to be exacting, diligent and

well adjusted, although fairly shy. Some years later, Joan chose to move to another Catholic Charities site in Southold, where she could be even more independent. She's there today, holding down a job and living a high quality life, with a great deal of freedom, not so very different from that of most Long Island parishioners. Now, Joan's story could have turned out quite differently. After all, what happens to a young, developmentally disabled woman who loses her family? Does she end up in a cold, impersonal institution? Is she taken advantage of and mistreated? Does she become homeless, hopeless and forgotten?

Our Church responds to those in need. The Church says she comes home, and the place Joan calls home was built and is sustained by the generosity of our parishioners. Each year the challenges facing Catholic Charities grow.

More than ever before, your support will help people and families in need in our neighborhoods.

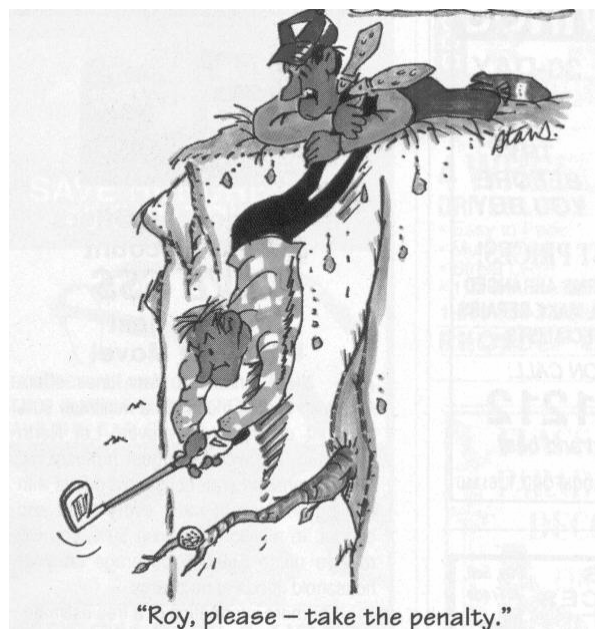

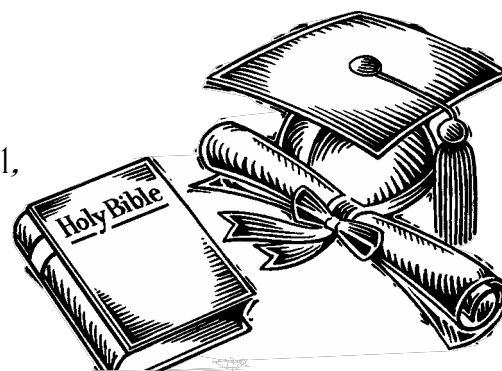
