St Joseph's Parish Monthly Recollection

On the First Friday of every month, at 7:30 PM, we hold our Monthly Parish Recollection. This is an hour of prayer, of recollection before our Lord present in the Blessed Sacrament - whose Sacred Heart is the source of immense charity and generous love. The foundation of this prayer is God's presence in our souls as Creator, Preserver, and Author of Graces ("in Him we live, and move, and are" Acts 17:28). God is our Father, and our Friend and is our sweet Guest. We must acknowledge the realization of this great truth: God is in each of us, our soul is His Temple.

This prayer of recollection includes the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Benediction, Praying of the Psalms, Silence, Gospel Reading and a Talk /Reflection on the following topics: The Cardinal Virtues of prudence, justice, temperance and fortitude. The Theological Virtues of faith, hope and love. The gifts of the Holy Spirit; wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear of the Lord.

Every soul, hungry & thirsty for God, is invited to this holy hour every First Friday of the month to adore, venerate & contemplate the Sacred Heart of Jesus, & to have a quiet dialogue with God.

Baptism

Celebrated most Sundays at 1:30pm. Please contact Parish Office when child is born to schedule Baptism Preparation requirements and date of Baptism.

Confirmation

A parish program building on foundation laid by the School and Religious Education Program. There is a separate program for any adult or teenager who has not yet been confirmed. Those interested should contact the Parish Office.

Marriage

Couples should contact the Parish Office to see one of the priests or deacons at least 6 months before the proposed wedding date, and before making any other arrangements. Both parties must complete marriage preparation programs before the marriage date. At least one of the parties must be registered in the parish.

Anointing of the Sick

This is a Sacrament for the living. A Catholic should receive this Sacrament if they are chronically ill, or are about to undergo surgery and hospitalization, or are suffering the effects of advanced age. We celebrate it during a Special Mass each Spring and Fall. Reception of the Sacrament at other times can be arranged by contacting the Parish Office.

Holy Orders

Anyone feeling called to the priesthood or religious life should feel free to contact one of the parish priests or deacons for guidance and direction.

Interested in becoming a Catholic?

Anyone interested in becoming a Catholic can contact the Parish Office for information about becoming part of the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults.

OUR LITURGY

In today's first reading, Peter calls for people to repent for Christ died for our sins, as the prophets foretold. The second reading asserts that the death of Jesus was expiation for the sins of the whole world. In the Gospel, the Risen Jesus appears to the disciples and opens their minds to understand the Scriptures regarding Him.

From the Pastor's Desk

Our Gospel Reading takes up where the Gospel for Easter Sunday Afternoon left off about the two disciples on the Road to Emmaus. The Gospel tells us that they were walking along the road discussing all that had happened on Good Friday and how the women came back with the story that Jesus' body was not in the tomb. We are told how this stranger came upon and asked them what they were talking about, and when they answered him, he began to speak about how the Scriptures told how the Christ would have to suffer and die so all could be made right again. Only at the end of the day did they recognize Him when they were at table and He broke the Bread. Today's Gospel begins with the two after they arrived back in Jerusalem. As we read, "While they were still speaking about this, he stood in their midst and said to them, 'Peace be with you!' But they were startled and terrified and thought they were seeing a ghost. Then he said to them, 'Why are you troubled? And why do questions arise in your hearts?'"

Now some 2012 years later, we might ask the same questions about the disciples; why did they have trouble believing in the Resurrection? Well before we judge them, we should ask the same questions of those who refuse to believe in it today. To answer both questions in part, I would like to quote what is written in the commentary from the Workbook for Lectors, Gospel Readers, and Proclaimers of the Word (which we give to all Priests, Deacons, and Lectors to help them prepare for the Sunday Readings). The commentator writes, "Often someone expresses the need to see miracles, some unmistakable sign, in order to believe. Then, when you point to one, they say, 'That's no miracle!' Hearing claims of the Resurrection, most of the disciple insisted on proof-seeing Jesus, today his hands and side. So Jesus appears and what happens? Panic, fright, doubts, troubled hearts, and talk of seeing a ghost. Even when they touch his hands and feet, they remain incredulous, forcing Jesus to consume a fish to convince them he is real. In these first Sundays of Easter Time, we read of post-Resurrection appearances whose original intent was to bolster faith in the risen Christ."

They did not believe at first, so how can we help those who do not believe now? The same way Jesus convinced the disciples 2000 years ago; He taught them, and eventually He and the Father sent the Holy Spirit upon them. As we read, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the law of Moses and in the prophets and the psalms must be fulfilled! Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures." This opening their minds is the sending of the Holy Spirit so they could understand.

And once they understood, He told them, "You are witnesses of these things." And so are we, not in the way the early Church was, but in the ways that we have seen God work in our lives. In the ways that what we read in the Gospel and the rest of the New Testament resonates in our hearts, and how we know it to be true. We can also be witnesses to this age because we too have received the Holy Spirit in Baptism and Confirmation and the Holy Spirit will give us the right words to say to help those who do not believe, even if they have seen miracles happened or felt the presence of God and still do not believe. To help them, all we have to do is not be afraid. All we have to do is be excited about our faith like the two who returned from Emmaus with what they had seen. We have to proclaim Jesus everywhere, even when people will not listen to us. We must be like Thomas was in last week's Gospel when he finally saw the Risen Lord and we too must say, "My Lord and my God!"

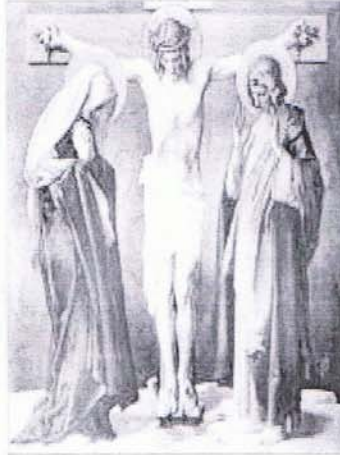

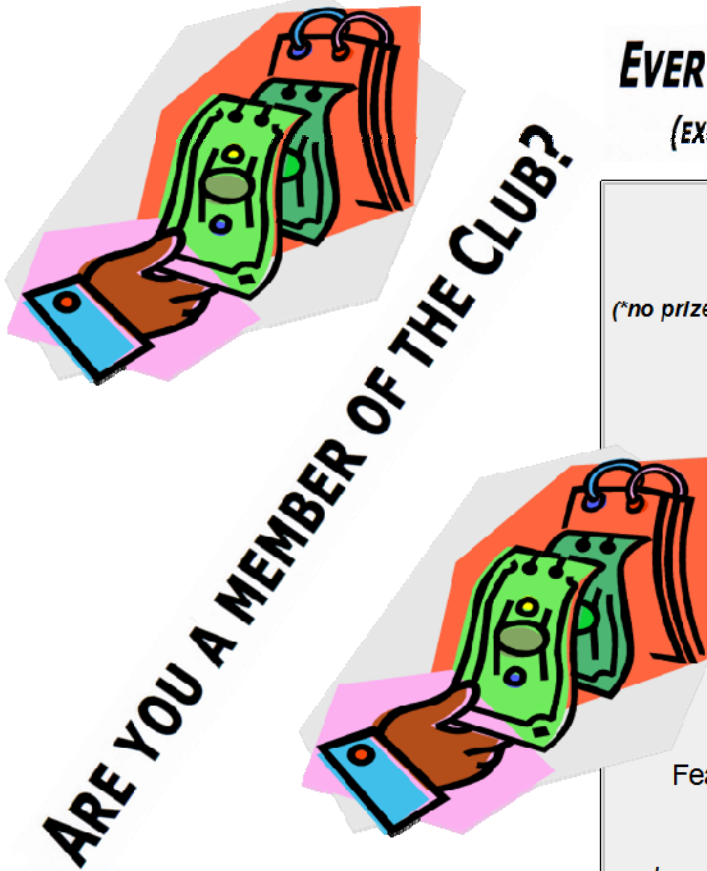
