St Joseph's Parish Monthly Recollection

On the First Friday of every month, at 7:30 PM, we hold our Monthly Parish Recollection. This is an hour of prayer, of recollection before our Lord present in the Blessed Sacrament - whose Sacred Heart is the source of immense charity and generous love. The foundation of this prayer is God's presence in our souls as Creator, Preserver, and Author of Graces ("in Him we live, and move, and are" Acts 17:28). God is our Father, and our Friend and is our sweet Guest. We must acknowledge the realization of this great truth: God is in each of us, our soul is His Temple.

This prayer of recollection includes the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Benediction, Praying of the Psalms, Silence, Gospel Reading and a Talk /Reflection on the following topics: The Cardinal Virtues of prudence, justice, temperance and fortitude. The Theological Virtues of faith, hope and love. The gifts of the Holy Spirit; wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear of the Lord.

Every soul, hungry & thirsty for God, is invited to this holy hour every First Friday of the month to adore, venerate & contemplate the Sacred Heart of Jesus, & to have a quiet dialogue with God.

Baptism

Celebrated most Sundays at 1:30pm. Please contact Parish Office when child is born to schedule Baptism Preparation requirements and date of Baptism.

Confirmation

A parish program building on foundation laid by the School and Religious Education Program. There is a separate program for any adult or teenager who has not yet been confirmed. Those interested should contact the Parish Office.

Marriage

Couples should contact the Parish Office to see one of the priests or deacons at least 6 months before the proposed wedding date, and before making any other arrangements. Both parties must complete marriage preparation programs before the marriage date. At least one of the parties must be registered in the parish.

Anointing of the Sick

This is a Sacrament for the living. A Catholic should receive this Sacrament if they are chronically ill, or are about to undergo surgery and hospitalization, or are suffering the effects of advanced age. We celebrate it during a Special Mass each Spring and Fall. Reception of the Sacrament at other times can be arranged by contacting the Parish Office.

Holy Orders

Anyone feeling called to the priesthood or religious life should feel free to contact one of the parish priests or deacons for guidance and direction.

Interested in becoming a Catholic?

Anyone interested in becoming a Catholic can contact the Parish Office for information about becoming part of the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults.

OUR LITURGY

The Sprinkling of the blood of the young bulls upon the people and splashing it upon the altar ratified the covenant between God and the Jews. From the Pastor's Desk

What is the Holy Eucharist? The Holy Eucharist is a Sacrament and a Sacrifice. In the Holy Eucharist, under the appearance of bread and wine, the Lord Jesus is contained, offered and received. When did Jesus institute the Holy Eucharist? Jesus instituted the Holy Eucharist at the Last Supper on the night before He died. What happened at the Last Supper when Our Lord said: "This is my body...this is my blood?" When Our Lord said, "This is my body" the bread was changed into His body; when He said "This is my blood;" the wine was changed into His blood. Did anything of the bread and the wine remain after they had been changed into Our Lord's Body and Blood? After the bread and wine had been changed into Our Lord's body and blood, there remained the appearance of bread and wine. What do we mean by the appearance of bread and wine? By the appearance of bread and wine, we mean their color, taste, weight, and shape [The appearance of anything, are the things we can see, touch, and taste. The substance of anything is what it is. The appearance in the Holy Eucharist is what looks like bread and wine. The substance is Our Lord Himself.]

These questions and answers from the Baltimore Catechism (which are the same from the current Catechism of the Catholic Church) tell us what it is we celebrate today in this great gift and mystery of our faith; Christ Present Body, Blood, Soul, Humanity and Divinity in the Blessed Sacrament. The Eucharist is not merely a sign or symbol of Jesus, or just a reminder of Jesus, it is truly Jesus. It is Jesus giving Himself to the Church so we may always remain faithful to Him and carry out the Gospel. When we receive the Holy Eucharist, we are healed of all that stands in our way from being one with Christ and the Father who sent Him.

Christ is made present in the Eucharist during the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, which is the Eucharist in action. In this action, Jesus gives Himself and us to His Father as we offer with Him. Christ is the hidden priest, and the priest we see takes His place (acting in the Person of Christ). The Mass reminds us of the Sacrifice of Christ on the Cross and it is a living reminder since it actually is the same act of life giving love. The Mass is the highest and greatest prayer (it is the Summit and Source of our Life. It is in fact the most important hour of our week, it is the greatest gift and privilege that we have received, and we should not take it for granted or not come. Remember there are people around the world and even in this country who wish that they could have weekly Mass but they do not because there are not enough priest to go around. We are fortunate that we still can have Mass every week, even every day, but if more people do not answer the

call to Holy Orders and Religious Life this can change in our lifetime. That is why we are so grateful for what we celebrate as a Diocese and as a Parish as Deacon Michael Duffy (our Pastoral Year Student from 2 years ago) was ordained a Priest yesterday (Saturday June 9th) and celebrates his First Mass in Wantagh, his home parish and will celebrate the 12 Noon Mass here next Sunday. This is a perfect weekend to be ordained a priest as we celebrate the Mystery of Eucharist on this Solemnity. Due to Father Duffy's Ordination, we will not have our usual Procession with the Blessed Sacrament, but we will have it next year, sorry for any disappointment this may cause.

Do not forget our Stewardship Appeal for all of our ministries, and we do hope that you are asking God what time and talent you can offer to St. Joseph's, so we can truly be a community committed to spreading the Good News and a living part of the Body of Christ.

Please remember the Catholic Ministries' Appeal, if you have not made a pledge to this worthwhile appeal there is still time, and also remember that when we make our goal St. Joseph's receives a payback of over \$20,000 that we can use to keep this place going. But we cannot do it without your help and the help of all registered parishioners. If you have made a pledge thank you, you will help so many people by your generosity.

God bless you always and thank you for all you do for St. Joseph's.

Respect Life

Tuesday, June 26 is Primary Day for United States Senatorial and Congressional candidates, and all are encouraged to vote. Are you registered? Call the Suffolk County Board of Elections at 631-852-4500 to find out.

Perhaps you didn't know this either, but on March 21, 2012 the New York State Legislature finally agreed to pass a bill to create the **Certificate of Stillbirth**. It took many bereaved parents more than ten years to secure this document, which affirms recognition of their stillborn children. And the bill is retroactive, so parents who have lost a child to stillbirth in the past are eligible to secure a birth certificate for that child. Applications are available online at <http://www.health.ny.gov/forms/doh5056.pdf> or you can request by mail: New York State Department of Health Vital Records Stillbirth Unit, P.O. Box 2602, Albany, NY 12220-2602.

Last month in our parish we had the Baby Bottle campaign to benefit the Life Center of Long Island.. The following are some of the actions made possible by your donations:

>Crisis intervention consultation for abortion-minded women.

Every month, the Life Center of LI receives over 300 phone calls from women seeking an abortion. We make sure that women and men receive accurate and complete information about pregnancy and abortion. They also receive Free Pregnancy testing and arrangements for a free sonogram with a doctor.

>Financial and material support for women who choose life.

This means layettes, strollers, cribs, car seats, clothing and other baby items. It also means assistance in obtaining maternity housing, schooling and medical care.

>Individual and group post-abortive consultation.

This is an opportunity for any person who has struggled with the emotional or spiritual pain of an abortion experience to find reconciliation and healing.

>Promotion of abstinence education in public and private schools.

LI Teen Freedom is our abstinence education program, with a goal to empower every adolescent in Long island with the skills necessary to practice abstinence, and have lives that are free from the negative consequences of premarital sex.

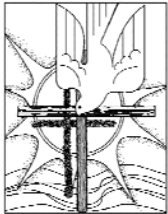

Baptismal Ministry

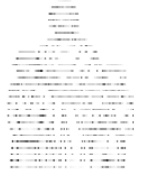
