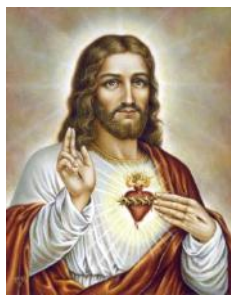

St Joseph's Parish Monthly Recollection

On the First Friday of every month, at 7:30 PM, we hold our Monthly Parish Recollection. This is an hour of prayer, of recollection before our Lord present in the Blessed Sacrament - whose Sacred Heart is the source of immense charity and generous love. The foundation of this prayer is God's presence in our souls as Creator, Preserver, and Author of Graces ("in Him we live, and move, and are" Acts 17:28). God is our Father, and our Friend and is our sweet Guest. We must acknowledge the realization of this great truth: God is in each of us, our soul is His Temple. This prayer of recollection includes the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Benediction, Praying of the Psalms, Silence, Gospel Reading and a Talk /Reflection on the following topics: The Cardinal Virtues of prudence, justice, temperance and fortitude. The Theological Virtues of faith, hope and love. The gifts of the Holy Spirit; wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear of the Lord.

Every soul, hungry & thirsty for God, is invited to this holy hour every First Friday of the month to adore, venerate & contemplate the Sacred Heart of Jesus, & to have a quiet dialogue with God.

Baptism

Celebrated most Sundays at 1:30pm. Please contact Parish Office when child is born to schedule Baptism Preparation requirements and date of Baptism.

Confirmation

A parish program building on foundation laid by the School and Religious Education Program. There is a separate program for any adult or teenager who has not yet been confirmed. Those interested should contact the Parish Office.

Marriage

Couples should contact the Parish Office to see one of the priests or deacons at least 6 months before the proposed wedding date, and before making any other arrangements. Both parties must complete marriage preparation programs before the marriage date. At least one of the parties must be registered in the parish.

Anointing of the Sick

This is a Sacrament for the living. A Catholic should receive this Sacrament if they are chronically ill, or are about to undergo surgery and hospitalization, or are suffering the effects of advanced age. We celebrate it during a Special Mass each Spring and Fall. Reception of the Sacrament at other times can be arranged by contacting the Parish Office.

Holy Orders

Anyone feeling called to the priesthood or religious life should feel free to contact one of the parish priests or deacons for guidance and direction.

Interested in becoming a Catholic?

Anyone interested in becoming a Catholic can contact the Parish Office for information about becoming part of the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults.

From the Pastor's Desk

The crowd kept coming to John the Baptist and people asked him what should we do? How shall we live to be happy in this life? John seemed to have all of the answers to their questions. He told the tax collectors, the soldiers, and others what they should do and what they should avoid. Note that his answers totally agreed with teachings found in the Old Testament, and will go along with all Jesus will say. John gave them all good advice, and if they followed it, they would have a clear conscience. Look at what he said.

To the tax collectors he told them to collect only what was prescribed. To the soldiers, he told them not to extort or falsely accuse and to be satisfied with their wages and so on. If John was speaking today, he would tell husbands and wives to love each other, he would tell parents to love and respect their children and vice versa. To police officers, he would tell them to be the best public servants they could be and to enforce the law fairly and equally. To lawyers, Saint John would tell them to seek justice for all, and to banker, stockbrokers, and merchants to be fair in their dealings and not seek excessive profits, and to do their part to improve the economic conditions of all. To the President and Congress, he would tell them to get their act together and start serving the country and not their own self-interest. To priests, deacons, religious, and bishops he would tell them to work hard for the Kingdom of God and to serve God's People according to the model set by Jesus the Good Shepherd. And of course, this list can go on and on. It is up to you to ask St. John what he would tell you according to your station in this life.

John of course told the people 2012 years ago that he was not the one they were expecting to come, but they should not be upset, rather they should rejoice for the Messiah is on His way. This call to rejoice is the theme of this Third Sunday of Advent, as we prepare to welcome our Lord when He returns in Full Glory and now as we turn our attention to celebrating His First Coming at Christmas. Rejoice for in nine days we will experience the joy of the Great Mystery of the Incarnation; when God in the person of Jesus truly became one of us. This is indeed what St. Paul tells us in today's Letter to the Philippians. In fact it is the text from this letter which gives us the name of this Third Sunday Gaudete/ Rejoice. With this in mind, it is worth repeating the text in this space. "Brothers and sisters: Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: rejoice! Your kindness should be known to all. The Lord is near. Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving make your request known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus."

As we get closer and closer to Christmas let us do our part to help people to come home to the Church and Belong More Deeply to Christ and His living Body the Church. Invite them to come to Mass with you on Christmas, next Sunday even. Tell them if it has been a long time since they have been here to come.

To help prepare them so that they can fully rejoice, we will be celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation on the Saturdays before Christmas from 4-4:45 PM and following the Morning Masses on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday before Christmas and we will celebrate the **Sacrament on Thursday night December 20th 7-8:30 PM**. If it's been a long time, don't worry about what you are to say or that the priest will be hard to deal with. We in fact will be very happy to help you celebrate the Sacrament and help you to come home.

The schedule of Masses for Christmas Eve and Day is: For Christmas Eve Monday December 24th: 4PM Upper and Lower Church, 6 PM, and 10:30 PM (note there is no Mid-night Mass and there has not been on here for over 14 years). On Tuesday December 25th Christmas Day: 7 AM, 9AM, 10:30 AM, and 12 Noon, Also note there is no 5 PM Mass on Christmas Day so our staff and ministers can be with their families.

Let us close with the Entrance Antiphon from today's Mass: Rejoice in the Lord always, again I say rejoice. Indeed the Lord is near.

Happy Third Week of Advent and don't forget to be rosy all day

Respect Life

The following is a statement sometimes heard in the political arena:

"I'm personally opposed to abortion, but I don't believe that there should be legislation against it."

This argument fails because it does not tell us why the person is opposed to abortion. Most people oppose abortion because they believe the unborn are fully human and have all the rights that go along with such a status. The magic catch phrase "freedom to choose" does not make all choices equally legitimate.

The so-called 'pro choice' position always overlooks the victim's right to choose. Women do not choose rape, blacks did not choose slavery, Jews did not choose concentration camps, and babies do not choose abortion.

From the child's point of view there is no such thing as a safe, legal abortion. For every two people who enter an abortion facility, only one comes out alive.

Stem cells have long been in the news. They are cells that are found in the human body, in both the unborn and the already born. They are the basic building blocks of different body parts and organs, such as the heart, the liver, lungs, etc. They may, now and in the future, be used to cure many diseases and chronic conditions, such as paralysis.

There are several ways to obtain human stem cells. One way is to take them from a human embryo, which is a human being at a very early stage of about eight days. Doing this, obviously, causes the death of that embryo, that person, and is always unethical. It's important to note that no progress in curing diseases or relieving chronic conditions has been seen so far with embryonic stem cell research.

The other ways to obtain human stem cells are 1) to take them from umbilical cord blood immediately after birth, 2) take them from living people from different parts of the body such as nasal passages, baby teeth, your own skin, and so on. This is ethical stem cell research –no one is killed by any such process.

It all comes down to morality. We have many laws based on moral concepts. Few complain about laws banning rape, theft, murder and incest because it is widely recognized that these laws protect others who have a right not to be harmed by such behavior, and pro life people believe that life begins at conception and therefore abortion is considered as taking a life – that's it in a nutshell, as they say.

Facial expressions similar to the baby's parents can be seen at this time. This month REMs (rapid eye movements) have been recorded— a sign of dreaming, Your spiritually adopted baby is already well-formed, internally and externally. Again, thank you and may God Bless you and your families with a Very Merry Christmas, and a Happy and Healthy New Year.

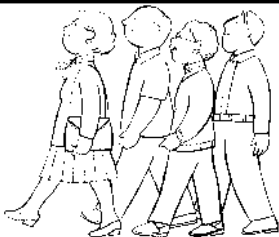
