The evening ends with Benediction.

Every soul, hungry and thirsty for God, is invited to this holy hour every First Friday of the month to adore, venerate and contemplate the Sacred Heart of Jesus and to have a quiet dialogue with God.

Good News for divorced Catholics

The following letter, written by Bishop Murphy, came to the priests of the diocese on June 29. I feel the need to share this news that will be good news for many:

My dear brother priests:

It pleases me to write you on this Solemn Feast of the great Apostles, Saints Peter and Paul. You and I share their zeal for the Gospel and are renewed each year in this great celebrations. As you know, the successor of St Peter, Pope Francis, has been calling our attention to a particular concern for families and our pastoral care for them. I hope you have had the opportunity to read his Wednesday catecheses over the last few months. They have been excellent. The preparation for the for the Synod for the Family in the fall has led me to consider ways here in the Diocese of Rockville Centre to help people—particularly those Catholics married outside the Church - to be reconciled to the Church and to live fully in the Communion of the Church.

After discussing the matter with the Vicars and with Msgr. James Pereda, our Judicial Vicar, I have decided to eliminate all fees (except for a \$100 registration fee) for those individuals seeking a declaration of nullity. The purpose of the registration fee is simply to show some level of commitment to pursuing the case before the Tribunal staff expends a significant amount of work on it.

At present, the fee of \$1,100 only partially covers the cost of maintaining a professional office of canon lawyers and support staff, and other expenses involved in processing the cases. The rest of the cost is subsidized by the generosity of the people of the Diocese. While the fee has always been waived for those who could not afford it, the very existence of a fee discouraged others from applying. By taking this step, and by planning appropriately for the Tribunal budget for the coming year and beyond, I hope and pray that those who have been unable or unwilling to seek a declaration of nullity will now be more willing to do so.

While I wanted to write to you personally to share this information before it is made public, I am asking Sean Dolan to coordinate communication of this news with Catholic and local media so that we might take this as an opportunity to invite our brothers and sisters to share the gift of the Lord's mercy and live fully in His Church. The Tribunal is pleased to support you as this new policy is promulgated throughout the Diocese.

What does this letter from the bishop mean?

First, an annulment is not saying that a marriage never happened. It is saying that something got in the way of the sacramental aspect of that marriage. The thing that got in the way occurred before the marriage even took place - example: A couple is engaged but have not set a date yet. A few months later they come to their parents and explain that they are expecting a child. The parents say, "You will be married by the end of the week." and they are married just as the parents say. The statement and action by the parents could become grounds for an annulment later on because it got in the way of their freely giving themselves in marriage.

An annulment is a way of freeing a person to live in love - to not be bound by a previous mistake. It is the Church living God's mercy. Unfortunately, because of the level of professionals involved there are costs involved. In the past, the Church asked those applying for an annulment to take responsibility for about 1/3 of the cost (\$1,100) if they could. Now the Church is only asking for a \$100 registration fee.

Where does the rest of the money come from? Things like the Catholic Ministries Appeal support works of mercy like this. So when you make your commitment to the CMA, you are reaching out a healing hand to someone who is divorced but wants to remarry and continue to live the sacramental life in the Church.

I am divorced and remarried, what about me? Wait a month or so because this is still in process. Then call the Diocesan Tribunal Office (516) 678-5800 and ask how to begin the process of an annulment. Once the process is complete, contact the parish office and ask about renewing your vows in the church!

SUPREME COURT DECISION [of 6/25/2015] UNDERSCORES NEED FOR NO TAXPAYER FUNDING FOR ABORTION ACT.

WASHINGTON – 6/25/2015 - The National Right to Life Committee today reacted to the U.S. Supreme Court's decision in King v. Burwell.

"Federal taxpayer subsidies are helping pay for over 1,000 health plans that cover abortion on demand, and today's Supreme Court decision underscores that only Congress can put a stop to that," said Carol Tobias, president of National Right to Life.

"This decision again demonstrates the need for enactment of the No Taxpayer Funding for Abortion Act, which would permanently prevent taxpayer subsidies for abortion-covering health plans, both in Obamacare and in other federal health benefits programs," Tobias said.

The bill, introduced in 2015 as the "No Taxpayer Funding For Abortion and Abortion Insurance Full Disclose Act H.R. 7/S.582, was passed in the House on January 22, 2015 but has not seen Action in the U.S. Senate.

In September 2014, the Government Accountability Office (GAO), the nonpartisan investigatory arm of Congress, issued a report containing information that confirmed predictions by National Right to Life that federally subsidized abortion-covering health plans would become a widespread feature of Obamacare. That report found that more than one thousand federally subsidized exchange plans currently cover elective abortion. Currently, 26 states and the District of Columbia allow coverage of elective abortion in health plans that qualify for the federal subsidies (while 24 states have restricted or prohibited such coverage).

PARENTAL CHOICE IN EDUCATION ACT TO ENACT THE EDUCATION

STATEMENT OF CARDINAL DOLAN

June 22, 2015

I am heartened by the promising news out of Albany, that the Governor, and the leadership of the State Senate and the State Assembly, have reached an agreement that will enable the payment of \$250 million in unreimbursed mandated services to Catholic and other religious and non-public schools around New York State. This money, which has been owed for several years, is sorely needed by our schools, many of whom have been struggling to remain open.

We Catholic leaders were part of a broad coalition of religious leaders, business executives, labor officials, parents, and many others, all of whom fought long and hard on behalf of the Education Investment Tax Credit, a bill that would have helped all of our children, in public, religious, charter, and private schools. We are disappointed that, once again, we have come up short, but we will redouble our efforts next year to make this common-sense bill become law. We remain ever more committed to the principle of parental choice in education.

However, on behalf of Catholics throughout New York, and especially the parents who send their children to our schools, let me express appreciation to Governor Cuomo, Senate Majority Leader Flanagan, and Assembly Speaker Heastie for recognizing the needs of our schools, and the action they have taken today.

Catholic schools for generations have been a lifeline for low-income families. Our schools have helped countless children, many of them new to our shores, reach their full potential and rise out of poverty. We are committed to maintaining a strong Catholic school system, and continue to urge lawmakers to finally do their part in helping these parents exercise their right to educational choice for their children.

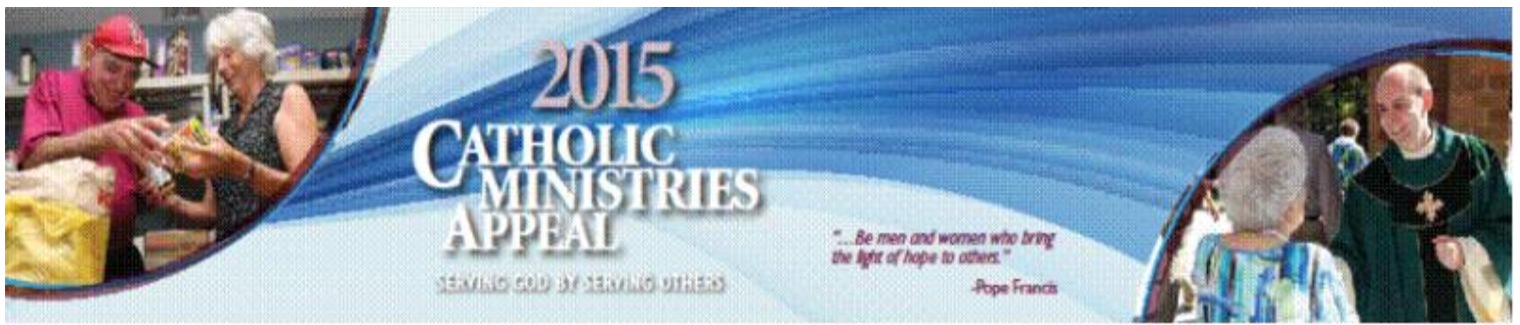

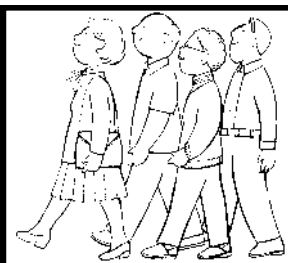
